1. PURPOSE:

Carilion Medical Center (CMC) is committed to providing a well-qualified faculty to ensure proper teaching and supervision for fellows, residents, and medical students. Faculty members are critical to the functioning of residency and fellowship programs. Program directors have the responsibility to ensure that all who educate residents effectively role model the Core Competencies. There may be faculty in a department who are not part of the educational program. The program director must control who is teaching residents.

2. SCOPE:

This Policy applies to all full-time and part-time paid or volunteer faculty associated with the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME), Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA), and Council for Podiatry Medical Education (CPME) accredited post-graduate training programs sponsored by CMC.

3. DEFINITIONS:

- A. <u>Program or Residency Program</u> refers to an accredited or non-accredited post-graduate medical education program based at Carilion Medical Center.
- B. <u>Program Director</u> is the lead physician, dentist or podiatrist appointed by the Institution and registered with the appropriate ACGME Residency Review Committee, CODA, or CPME to provide academic and administrative oversight of the respective Program.
- <u>C.</u> <u>Resident</u> refers to all interns, residents, and fellows participating in CMC's postgraduate medical education programs.

4. PROCEDURE:

A. The program director must have the authority to approve program faculty members for participation in the residency program education at all sites.



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- B. Each program must develop a process for faculty selection. Selection processes should be informed by the specialty RRCs when applicable.
- C. Core faculty members must be designated by the program director. They must be listed in the ACGME ADS system.
- D. The program director must develop and oversee a process to evaluate candidates prior to approval as program faculty members for participation in the residency program education and at least annually thereafter.
- E. The program director must have the authority to approve or remove Physicians and non-physicians as faculty members at all participating sites, including the designation of core faculty members. Program directors must work with their chairs and participating site directors to facilitate these changes.
